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Identifying MHPSAs: HRSA designates MH shortage areas

- HRSA is the federal agency tasked with identifying national health care workforce problems
- Methods used to measure shortages (primary care, dental) were updated
- Federal MHPSA designation method needs updating



Identifying MHPSAs: HRSA designates MH shortage areas

- Number of mental health professionals required to "eliminate a shortage"
- Primary focus: geographic
- Theory and methods for MHPSA designation based on primary care methodology
 - No use of epidemiology of mental illness
 - Fails to assess the complex needs and utilization patterns of SMI population



Identifying MHPSAs: HRSA designates MH shortage areas

- Current method:
 - Crude: population-to-provider ratios
 - Insensitive: Special needs of SMI population not measured
 - Not Comprehensive: New professions online now providing MH services, e.g., licensed professional counselors
 - Outdated: New improved geographic analysis and workforce planning techniques are available




Identifying MHPSAs: UNC Sheps Center project goal

- Develop a method to identify mental health professional shortage areas
 Using available data
 - Feasible to update periodically
- Quantifies shortage observed by the Annapolis Coalition report

Helps set the stage for subsequent discussion of mental health workforce issues



Identifying MHPSAs: Building scores






Compiling MHPSA scores: Adjusting and smoothing

- Need estimates were deflated to adjust for mental health services provided by primary care providers
- Need estimates were smoothed to account for travel across county boundaries
 - Each county estimate is a weighted average of the index county and nearby counties




% Need for prescribers that is met across NC

Identifying MHPSAs: Challenges for the future

Expand the scope on both need and supply sides
Assess needs of additional special populations

- persons with co-occurring substance abuse
- children, homeless adults, linguistically isolated, etc.
- Assess the supply
 - Distinguish between public and private sectors
 - expanded practice scope (eg nurse and psychologist prescribers)
 - additional professions (eg pharmacists)

Move beyond counting to address quality of care issues



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
