South Carolina Provider Mix As of November 10, 2008

- Using claims data, between 48% and 98% of family planning waiver participants went to a health department clinic in fiscal year 2006; this percent varied widely by county. The use of the health departments was greater in more rural, poor counties. About one third of the counties had health department use between 62% and 69%.
- Using claims data, an average of 271 clients per month in FY 2006 used federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) for family planning waiver services.
- In a 2006 survey of participants we found the following provider mix (self-report). You can see that it doesn't match the claims data, perhaps because we had fewer rural participants, or people are not fully aware of how to categorize where they received services.
