Introduction

This is the thirty-third annual report prepared from data collected by the North Carolina Health Professions Data System (HPDS). The HPDS was developed to collect and disseminate timely and reliable data on licensed health professionals in North Carolina. Initiated in 1975 with federal funding from the National Center for Health Statistics, the HPDS was assisted in the early 1980s by a grant from the Duke Endowment through the North Carolina Hospital Association. Although selected data are available beginning in 1976, continuous and equivalent data files have been maintained since 1979. For most professions these data include name, business address, birth year, gender, race, information on basic professional education, practice specialty, activity status, form of employment, and practice setting. Special analyses and reports from all data files may be requested (see Appendix III).

This report draws on data from the North Carolina HPDS and describes the supply and distribution in 2010 of licensed individuals in nineteen health professions by county and selected regions. The HPDS is maintained by the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Support for the HPDS is provided by the North Carolina Area Health Education Centers (NC AHEC) Program and the University of North Carolina Office of the Provost (Health Affairs). This report would not be possible without the cooperation of the independent health professions licensing boards that provide data to the HPDS.

Sources and Limitations of the Data

Source of Health Professions Data

Health professions data for this report are provided annually by the licensing boards for each of the following professions: certified nurse midwives, chiropractors, dental hygienists, dentists, licensed practical nurses, nurse practitioners, occupational therapists, occupational therapy assistants, optometrists, pharmacists, physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, physicians, physician assistants, podiatrists, practicing psychologists, psychological associates, registered nurses and respiratory therapists. The boards provide demographic, practice, and location information on every professional licensed to practice in the state of North Carolina. This year, and for the past thirty-two years, this annual report has been prepared using data current to October for each year; this makes it possible for users to perform longitudinal analyses and to examine yearly changes in health professionals over time.

Physician data are derived from the NC Medical Board's licensure files. These data contain physicians who are currently in postgraduate medical training programs but who have permanent licenses. In an effort to accurately separate physicians in residency training from those who are not in residency training, listings of physicians in postgraduate medical education programs as of July 2010 were obtained from all North Carolina residency program institutions. These lists were compared with the NC Medical Board's licensing file. Physicians in residency training were not included in the number of counts by county in this publication. All resident physicians enrolled in postgraduate medical education programs were identified and are reported in Table 1. This table excludes some fellowships.

Beginning in 2008, data on nurse practitioners (NPs) were acquired from the NC Board of Nursing; nurse practitioner data in prior publications (1979-2007) were obtained through the NC Medical Board. The NC Midwifery Joint Committee provided data on certified nurse midwives (CNMs). Data for physician assistants (PAs) were obtained from the NC Medical Board. Certified nurse midwives and nurse practitioners are included in the registered nurse (RN) counts.

Definitions and Limitations

Because state law requires a license to practice for each of the professions, the data reported here reflect an accurate enumeration of the supply and distribution of licensed practitioners. However, because the actual activity status of a given professional may change over time (i.e. the person may retire, move out of the state but maintain a license, or maintain a license while working in another profession), having a license does not always indicate that the individual is actively practicing. To adjust for this, the data presented in this report include only those individuals who indicated on their license registration renewal form that they were working in North Carolina and were actively engaged in the profession. Active status practitioners may include administrators, researchers and educators who are active in the profession but not engaged in direct patient care. Active status is assigned to individuals who are newly licensed and have not reported their status. Those with unknown activity status often include newly licensed professionals who at the time of licensure had not yet secured employment in their profession. Individuals who report a business address or hours but who do not report their status are also assigned an active status.³ Health care professionals are assigned to their self-designated primary practice location county if they are active, and to their mailing address county if they are active and their primary practice location is unknown. For physicians, this is based on ZIP code information; for all other professions, counties are identified by the professional on their licensure form. The nursing professions (registered nurses, certified nurse midwives, nurse practitioners, and licensed practical nurses) and the dental professions (dentists and dental hygienists) are grouped together in the region and county pages. Physicians are broken down separately. The remaining professions are listed in alphabetical order.

For the purpose of this report, doctors of medicine (MDs) and doctors of osteopathy (DOs), both of whom register with the NC Medical Board, are grouped together. Physicians are classified by specialty according to the self-reported primary specialty indicated on their initial or renewal application with the NC Medical Board. Physicians whose primary and/or secondary specialty has changed since 2009 were checked against specialty data provided by the NC Medical Society. Physician data in this report are classified by residency-training status in 2010 and federal or non-federal employment status. The physician data reported in this publication are for non-resident licensed physicians who are not currently participating in one of the postgraduate medical education programs listed in Table 1.

³ For physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants, individuals who report that they are not actively employed in physical therapy or occupational therapy but are seeking employment in physical or occupational therapy are also considered active. These are the only professions that have data available on whether individuals are seeking employment.

Within the category of non-resident physicians are federal and non-federal physicians. Physicians included in the federal category have reported that their principal employer is the federal government. These individuals may have primary practice settings in a health facility in a military installation, Department of Veterans Affairs, U.S. Public Health Service, Indian Health Service, or other federal health facility. Because their practices are in community settings, all National Health Service Corps physicians are included in the non-federal category, except for uniformed Public Health Service physicians who may be in a Health Service Corps placement. The NC Medical Board supplied the federal physician data reported in this document. Federal physicians practicing in government facilities are not required to be licensed by the NC Medical Board to practice medicine in North Carolina, so the numbers for federal physicians reported in this publication may fall short of the actual numbers of federal physicians in the state.

Beginning in 2003, physicians indicating non-federal status were checked against their primary practice setting. Physicians who indicated non-federal status but whose primary practice address was in a military setting were reclassified as federal physicians. Federal providers are not asked to specify their employment setting on the annual registration renewal form; therefore, military providers cannot be subcategorized within the federal providers' category.

The NC Board of Nursing requires biennial registration (in the birth month) for the state's registered nurses (RNs) and licensed practical nurses (LPNs) with half of the state's RNs and LPNs registering with the Board each year. Therefore, the report includes data on the 50% of RNs and LPNs who renewed their registration in 2010, and data for the remaining 50% who renewed their registration in their birth month of the previous year. Additionally, the NC Psychology Board requires biennial registration. Both the Board of Nursing and the Psychology Board update their data in non-renewal years to reflect address changes, new licensees and deceased practitioners.

Population Data

The 2010 projected population data reported in this publication were downloaded from the North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management. The 2010 county and state level population data are projected numbers as the 2010 estimates were not available at the time of publication. In addition, population data by age and gender projections were not yet available for 2010, and 2009 data will be used this year for the county, region and state level pages. The 2009 population figures are based on the April 1, 2000 Census. Ratios of health professionals reported are per 10,000 population, and 2010 population projections were used to calculate ratios per 10,000 population.

Demographic and Economic Data

This publication includes additional health, vital statistics and socio-demographic data. A list of the variable names, numbers, definitions, and the source of data by variable number can be found in *Appendix II: Definition of Terms*. All data provided in this publication are also available online at http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp/. The infant mortality rates reported in the 2010 State Totals, Non-Metropolitan/Metropolitan counties, Area Health Education Centers, Health Service Areas, the Department of Environment, Health and Natural Resources, and the Perinatal Care regions are computed as a one year rate.

This publication reports the number of general hospital discharges in 2009 from acute care, short-stay hospitals by county of patient residence. The data exclude normal newborn discharges (DRG 391).

Summary of Trends in North Carolina Health Professional Supply

The overall number of health professionals in North Carolina grew from November 2009 to October 2010. Table 2 summarizes the number of health professionals licensed in the past two years and the percent change in those numbers between 2009 and 2010.

This missing information was received in 2010 and these individuals are now included in the active file, resulting in what appears to be large increase in practitioners between 2009 and 2010.

The majority of health profession groups saw small to moderate growth in 2010. The number of primary care physicians increased 4.9% (+419) from 2009 to 2010, with internal medicine showing the largest growth (+223, 7.6%). Pediatricians (+ 101) also showed a large increase between 2009 and 2010, experiencing a growth rate of 6.2%. Obstetricians-gynecologists had a moderate percentage increase (+36, 3.5%) and family physicians also grew slightly (+53, 1.9%). The largest percentage increases in other health professions were seen by nurse practitioners (+265, 7.8%), occupational therapy assistants (+64, 5.9%), and physician assistants (+201, 5.8%). In 2010 there were moderate increases in the supply of physical therapists (+201, 4.1%), occupational therapists (+99, 4.0%), physical therapist assistants (+85, 3.8%), psychologists (+61, 3.2%), podiatrists (+8, 3.0%), dental hygienists (+135, 2.6%), registered nurses (+2,203, 2.4%), optometrists (+23, 2.3%), respiratory therapists (+86, 2.2%), and dentists (+85, 2.1%), and small increases in the number of pharmacists (+61, 0.7%). Between 2009 and 2010, both licensed practical nurses (-78, -0.4%) and certified nurse midwives (-2, -0.8%) experienced a small percent decrease in supply, while psychological associates experienced a moderate decrease (-28, -3.0%) in practitioners. The number of chiropractors showed the largest percentage increase (+229, 17.3%). However, this increase can be attributed to receiving and including previously missing variable information concerning the activity status of a large number of chiropractors, rather than a true increase in the number of new chiropractors in the state.

CHANGES IN SUPPLY

Physicians

The 4.3% (+851) growth of **physicians** licensed by the NC Medical Board between 2009 and 2010 was the largest yearly increase over the past ten years. In 2010, all but one county in North Carolina (Tyrrell) had at least one physician reporting a primary practice location in that county. Camden (1), Gates (1), Hyde (1), and Warren (2) Counties had the fewest number of physicians. Fifty-eight counties experienced an increase in the number of physicians, seventeen had no change in supply, and twenty-five counties lost physicians. Counties with the largest percentage growth in the supply of physicians between 2009 and 2010 included Hyde (+1, 100%), Perquimans (+1, 50%), Caswell (+4, 36.4%), and Davie (+7, 31.8%). The largest numeric growth was observed in Durham (+243, 14.1%) and Forsyth (+118, 8.1%) Counties. The largest reduction in numbers was in Jones County (-9, -34.6%), followed by Mitchell (-4, -14.3%) and Mecklenburg (-4, -0.2%) Counties.




Figure 1: Yearly Increases in Primary Care Physicians (PCPs), 2000-2010

Figure 1 depicts the annual growth rate of active licensed **primary care physicians**⁷ practicing in North Carolina over the past ten years. The supply of primary care physicians (PCPs) in North Carolina increased (+419, 4.9%) between 2009 and 2010; the highest rate of annual growth experienced over the past ten years. This increase in supply was slightly greater than the increase in the total physician supply (4.3%) in 2010. This year, the growth rate is greater than the increase in primary care physicians seen in

2009 (3.0%), making this the third consistent year of growth for primary care physicians. Forty-nine counties increased their numbers of primary care physicians, with Hyde (+1, 100.0%) and Davie (+4, 26.7%) experiencing the largest percentage gains. Durham (+126, 23.3%) and Forsyth (+66, 13.2%) Counties had the largest numeric gains. The number of primary care physicians remained stable in twenty counties, and thirty-one counties had a reduction in supply. Jones County had the largest numeric decrease (-8, -44.4%), followed by Johnston County (-4, -5.0%).

Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, and Certified Nurse Midwives

This year's 5.8% (+201) increase in **physician assistants** (PAs) marks another year of strong growth for the profession. In 2010, forty-eight counties expanded their PA supply with Jones (+1, 100.0%) doubling its supply, and Randolph County experiencing a 71.4% (+10) increase. Mitchell County added two PAs after having none in 2009. Twenty-eight counties experienced no change in their PA supply while twenty-four counties experienced decreases in their PA supply. Avery County lost its sole provider, joining six other counties that had no PAs in 2010 (Camden, Clay, Currituck, Gates, Hyde, and Tyrrell).

The 7.8% (+265) expansion in the **nurse practitioner** (NP) numbers in 2010 marked sixteen years of annual growth. Two counties, Camden and Perquimans⁸, had no nurse practitioners; these were the same counties that had none in 2009. Six counties had only one NP (Anson, Currituck, Gates, Hoke, Martin, and Tyrrell), with Anson and Currituck each having lost a nurse practitioner between 2009 and 2010. In total, fifty-seven counties increased their supply of nurse practitioners, while twenty-five lost providers and eighteen experienced no change.




Figure 2: Yearly Increases in Physicians, Physician Assistants (PAs), and Nurse Practitioners (NPs), 2000-2010

Figure 2 shows the annual growth for physicians, physician assistants (PAs), and nurse practitioners (NPs) over the past ten years. Between 2000 and 2010, the number of PAs and NPs grew rapidly, with both professions experiencing steady rates of increase since 2003. The 4.3% growth of physicians between 2009 and 2010 was the largest yearly increase over the past ten years, and with the exception of a small increase of 1.8% between 2008 and 2009, North Carolina's physician workforce has experienced steady increases in the rate of annual growth since 2005.

The state's **certified nurse midwives** (CNMs) data showed a slight decrease (-2, -0.8%) in supply between 2009 and 2010, a contrast to last year's 5.3% (+12) growth rate. Overall, twelve counties saw their CNM supply rise, seventy-three experienced no change, and fifteen counties lost providers, with Johnston County losing its only practitioner. Hertford, Pender, and Wilson Counties each gained one practitioner after having none in 2009. The largest increase in CNMs was seen in Onslow County (+5, 125.0%). Forty-seven counties in North Carolina that had no CNMs in 2010.

Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses




Figure 3: Yearly Increases in Registered Nurses (RNs) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs), 2002-2010

The **registered nurse** (RN) data showed a 2.4% (+2,203) rise in the number of RNs in the state between 2009 and 2010, a slightly lower growth rate when compared to recent years (*Figure 3*). Fortynine counties expanded their RN supply in 2010, five counties had no change in their RN supply, and forty-six counties experienced a loss in the number of RNs. As in 2009, Mecklenburg had the greatest number of RNs, with 10,700 active in the county. Tyrrell, again, had the fewest with seven RNs, followed by Camden (18) and Gates (22).

The supply of **licensed practical nurses** (LPNs) decreased by -0.4% (-78) between 2009 and 2010. This year's decline in growth comes after a small increase of 0.7% experienced between 2008 and 2009 (*Figure 3*). Thirty-eight counties increased their numbers of LPNs, fifty-two counties lost LPNs and ten counties did not show any change. Tyrell experienced the greatest percentage gain (+1, 100.0%) and Perquimans had the greatest percentage loss (-8, -34.8%).

Dentists and Dental Hygienists

Between 2009 and 2010, North Carolina experienced a 2.1% (+85) increase in its supply of dentists. Twenty-six counties showed reduced numbers of dentists between 2009 and 2010, thirty-three had no change in their supply of dentists, and forty-one counties saw their supply of dentists rise. Camden, Gates, Hyde, and Tyrrell remained the only four counties in the state without a dentist indicating a primary practice location. Bertie County had only one dentist in 2010. The largest percentage decrease in supply was seen in Jones County (-33.3%), which lost one dentist. The largest percentage increase was seen in Allegheny (100.0%) and Graham (100.0%) Counties, which each added one dentist, followed by Franklin County (75.0%), which gained three dentists.

In 2010, there was a 2.6% (+135) rise in the number of **dental hygienists** registered with the Board of Dental Examiners. This increase is slightly smaller than the increases seen in 2009 (3.6%) and 2008 (3.0%). Fifty-three counties showed growth in 2010 while twenty-seven counties experienced a decrease in their supply of hygienists. There were twenty counties with no change in the number of hygienists in 2010. Anson County had the largest percentage increase (+1, 50.0%). Allegheny, Currituck, Graham, and Jones Counties each lost one practitioner in 2010, taking their totals from three to two providers for the largest percentage decrease of -33.3%, and Rockingham had the largest decrease in numbers (-10, -14.5%).

Wake County had the largest increase in numbers (+17, 2.8%). Four counties had no active hygienist (Camden, Gates, Hyde and Tyrrell) in 2010.

Pharmacists




Figure 4: Yearly Increases in Pharmacists, 2000-2010

The total number of **licensed pharmacists** showed an increase of 0.7% (+61) between 2009 and 2010. *Figure 4* shows this is a smaller growth in the profession than seen in previous years. Between 2009 and 2010, the supply of pharmacists grew in fifty-four counties. Wake experienced the largest numerical increase (+70, 6.8%), while Allegheny experienced the largest percentage increase of 40.0% with the addition of two pharmacists. In 2010, Camden and Hyde were the only counties without a pharmacist indicating a practice location. Thirty-two counties lost pharmacists; the largest reduction in numbers occurred in Durham (-74, -11.2%) and Mecklenburg (-53, -5.6%). Gates (-1, -50.0%) and Tyrell (-1,-50.0%) had the largest percentage decrease leaving these counties with only one practicing pharmacist. Fourteen counties had no change in the number of pharmacists.

Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants

Between 2009 and 2010, the supply of licensed **physical therapists** (PTs) grew 4.1% (+201). Forty-six counties expanded their supply of PTs, twenty-two lost PTs, and thirty-two counties had no change in numbers. Four counties (Gates, Greene, Hyde, and Tyrrell) did not have a PT in 2010. The number of **physical therapist assistants** (PTAs) increased 3.8% (+85) in 2010, slightly larger than the 2.4% increase in 2009, but a small increase when compared to the 8.9% growth seen in 2008 (*Figure 5*). Fifty-two counties expanded their supply of PTAs, twenty lost PTAs, and twenty-eight counties had no change in numbers. Wake County experienced the largest numerical gain in PTAs (+8, 6.9%) and Carteret (-3, -20.0%), Brunswick (-3,-16.7%), and Gaston (-3, -5.1%) lost the greatest number of PTAs. Neither Camden nor Tyrrell counties had an active PTA in 2010.

Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy Assistants

Occupational therapists (OTs) experienced a 4.0% (+99) increase between 2009 and 2010. Thirty-eight counties gained providers, twenty-eight lost providers, and thirty-four counties experienced no change. Graham, Pamlico and Washington counties lost their only providers, leaving seven counties with no active OTs and seven counties with only one OT. Franklin County (-7, -53.8%) had the greatest numerical loss and Mecklenburg (+32, 10.3%) added the greatest number of providers between 2009 and 2010. Mecklenburg also had the greatest number of OTs, with 344 registered in the county, followed by Wake with 323. In 2010, occupational therapy assistants (OTAs) experienced a 5.9% (+64) supply increase. Forty counties gained providers, twenty-six counties lost providers, and thirty-four counties experienced no change. Perquimans lost its only OTA. Of the seven counties without an occupational therapist, three (Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Washington) did not have an occupational therapy assistant. Mecklenburg County (+16, 19.0%) had the greatest increase in the number of OTAs and Buncombe County (-4, -12.1%) had the greatest numerical loss in of providers.

Psychologists and Psychological Associates

The number of **practicing psychologists** in North Carolina increased 3.2% (+61) between 2009 and 2010. This marks the sixth year of consistent growth in the profession. There were twenty-four counties without a practicing psychologist in 2010 and fifteen counties that had only one psychologist. Twenty-six counties lost psychologists, forty-seven counties had no change in numbers and twenty-seven counties gained practicing psychologists. Between 2009 and 2010, the supply of **psychological associates** decreased (-28, -3.0%); with the exception of the 4.2% spike between 2008 and 2009, this decrease follows the negative growth trend from prior years. Overall, twenty-six counties lost psychological associates and

sixteen had none in 2010. Fifty-three counties experienced no change, and twenty-one gained psychological associates. Fifteen counties had only one provider.

Podiatrists, Optometrists and Chiropractors

In 2010, the **podiatry** workforce increased by eight practitioners (3.0%). Eleven counties gained podiatrists, six counties lost podiatrists, and eighty-three had no change in numbers. Forty-four counties had no podiatrists in 2010. Warren lost its only provider. Together, Forsyth, Guilford, Mecklenburg, and Wake accounted for more than one-third (38.0%) of all podiatrists in the state (103 out of 271).

North Carolina's **optometrist** workforce expanded by 2.3% (+23) in 2010; slightly greater than the 1.9% (+19) increase of 2009. Twenty-five counties gained providers, fourteen lost providers, and sixty-one counties experienced no change. Eleven of the twelve counties that had no optometrists in 2009 also had no optometrists in 2010. Perquimans which had none in 2009, gained a provider in 2010. Montgomery doubled its supply by adding an additional optometrist. Craven County (-6, -30.0%) lost the greatest number of optometrists, while Rowan (+6. 42.9%) gained the most.

Between 2009 and 2010, North Carolina's count of **chiropractors** saw an increase of 17.3% (+229). Missing variable information for the past few years created the inability to determine activity status of many new to file chiropractors. This missing information was received in 2010 and these individuals are now included in the active file, resulting in what appears to be large increase in practitioners between 2009 and 2010. In 2010, forty-seven counties increased their number of providers, thirteen lost providers, and forty experienced no change. Alleghany and Gates each lost their sole provider, leaving thirteen counties without an active chiropractor in 2010. Of these thirteen, eight counties have remained without any chiropractors since 1979. Clay and Edgecombe, which had no practitioners in 2009, each gained one chiropractor in 2010 while Mecklenburg had the greatest numeric gains (+61, 27.1%). Ashe (-2, -40.0%) and Lee (-2,-25.0%) had the greatest numeric loss in 2010. Mecklenburg and Wake again accounted for almost a third of chiropractors in the state (31.9%, 497 out of 1,556).

Respiratory Therapists

The number of **respiratory therapists** (RTs) in North Carolina increased by 2.2% (+86) from 2009 to 2010. This represents a consistent rate of increase since the profession was added to the HPDS in 2004. In 2010, forty-seven counties gained providers, twenty-five lost providers, and twenty-eight had no change. Camden lost its sole provider between 2009 and 2010, and there were fourteen counties with no active respiratory therapists. Northampton gained one provider after having none in 2009. Durham County experienced the largest numeric change (+19, 9.1%) while Jones (+1, 100.0%) and Washington (+2, 100.0%) both doubled their supply. Wake County experienced the largest numeric decrease (-14, -5.2%).

CHANGES IN PRACTITIONER TO POPULATION RATIOS

North Carolina's population increased 2.0% between 2009 and 2010, slightly greater than the growth rate experienced between 2008 and 2009. Any examination of the changes in the supply and distribution of the health care workforce must take into account North Carolina's population growth rate, as well as the differences in population growth rates across counties of the state. To account for these factors, changes in health professional supply are illustrated in this section by examining the number of health care professionals per 10,000 people. The practitioner per 10,000 population ratio provides a better mechanism to compare the supply and distribution of health professionals across varying geographic areas than the use of simple raw counts. Tables 3 through 13 (except Table 5) include the ten highest and lowest ranked North Carolina counties based on active physicians, primary care physicians, registered nurses, dentists, and pharmacists per 10,000 population.

Table 5 provides the physician and primary care physician ratios per 10,000 population based on American Medical Association (AMA) data for the United States, North Carolina, and selected states that border North Carolina. Caution should be used in comparing these figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the data book because of differences in the data collection and reporting efforts at the AMA.

Table 14 shows the practitioner per 10,000 population ratios for all North Carolina counties in alphabetical order. Similar to Table 2, those licensed professionals for whom activity status is "unknown" are included in the "active" category. Professionals are only counted once and are located in counties based on primary practice location.

Physicians per 10,000 Population Ratio

The 2010 ratio of North Carolina's physicians per 10,000 population was 21.7, slightly greater than the ratio in 2009. The counties with the ten largest and ten smallest ratios in 2010 are included in Tables 3 and 4.

According to data from the AMA and the U.S. Census Bureau, as seen in Table 5, there were, on average, about 22.7 physicians per 10,000 population in the United States in 2008. This is down slightly from 23.4 in 2007. According to the AMA data, North Carolina's ratio was 21.5, slightly lower than the national average.

Compared to adjacent states, North Carolina has fewer physicians per 10,000 population than Tennessee and Virginia, but more physicians per population than Georgia and South Carolina. As mentioned earlier, the county- and state-level ratios using the NC Medical Board data are difficult to compare with the AMA figures due to differences in methodology and timing of data collection and reporting.

Primary Care Physicians per 10,000 Population Ratio

On average, there were 9.4 primary care physicians per 10,000 population in North Carolina in 2010, a slight increase from 9.2 in 2009. Tables 6 and 7 illustrate the counties with the largest and the smallest primary care physicians per 10,000 population ratios.

According to the national AMA data (see Table 5 on page 14) which, as mentioned previously, has differences in data collection and timing of collection when compared to the HPDS, there were 8.2 primary care physicians per 10,000 population in the United States in 2008. This compares to a ratio in North Carolina of 8.1 primary care physicians per 10,000 population. Tennessee and Virginia had larger numbers of primary care physicians per 10,000 population than North Carolina (with ratios of 8.3 and 8.7, respectively), and Georgia and South Carolina had smaller ratios (7.2 and 7.5, respectively).

Dentists per 10,000 Population Ratio

North Carolina had 4.4 dentists per 10,000 population in 2010, the same ratio as in 2009. National statistics show a ratio of 5.7 dentists per 10,000 population for the U.S. in 2010. Caution should be used in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book because of differences in the data collection efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Tables 8 and 9 report the counties with the ten largest and ten smallest supplies of dentists per 10,000 population ratios in 2010. Of the four counties tied for 100, three—Camden, Hyde and Tyrrell—have not had a dentist with a primary practice location in the county since 1989 or earlier, while Gates lost its only dentist in 2005.

Registered Nurses per 10,000 Population Ratio

The average number of registered nurses (RNs) per 10,000 population increased slightly from 96.9 in 2009 to 97.3 in 2010. North Carolina's supply of RNs per 10,000 population is slightly higher than the 2010 national statistic of 92.0 RNs per 10,000 population. Caution should be used in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book because of differences in the data collection efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics.¹⁷ Tables 10 and 11 represent the counties with the largest and the smallest ratio of registered nurses per 10,000 population in 2010.

Pharmacists per 10,000 Population Ratio

On average, the state had 9.1 licensed pharmacists per 10,000 population in 2010, slightly less than in 2009. The national ratio is 8.3 licensed pharmacists per 10,000 population. Again, the reader is cautioned to use care in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the data book because of differences in the data collection efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. 


NORTH CAROLINA MAPS:

Physicians per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010





Physician Assistants per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010



Nurse Practitioners per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010




Certified Nurse Midwives (CNMs) per 10,000 Women Ages 15-44 North Carolina, 2010



Licensed Practical Nurses per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010




Dentists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010



Dental Hygienists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010






Occupational Therapists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010


Occupational Therapy Assistants per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010



Optometrists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010





Pharmacists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010





Physical Therapists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010






Podiatrists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010


Psychologists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2010



Appendix I: Technical Notes on Methods

This report is based on registration data obtained on selected licensed health professional categories within North Carolina between November 1, 2009 and October 31, 2010.

Data on the licensed health professionals profiled in this report were collected from both initial and renewal licensure forms by their respective licensing boards. All boards supplied computerized copies of their files containing all necessary data to the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research. All data files were run through a series of editing programs and procedures to check for inconsistencies.

Data were updated on a regular basis at each board with new licensees as well as changes in address. Physician data were checked and corrected for residency status using data supplied by hospitals with postgraduate medical education programs. Physician specialty data obtained from the 2010 *North Carolina Medical Society Roster* were used to check primary specialty codes. Physicians are the only profession assigned to county location based on ZIP code information.

Appendix II: Definition of Terms

4)	In-State	Licensed individuals who practice in North Carolina if they are active or who reside in North Carolina if they are inactive. If business county is missing for active individuals, mailing county is used.
5)	Out-of-State	Licensed individuals who practice outside of North Carolina if they are active or who reside outside of North Carolina if they are inactive. If business county is missing for active individuals, mailing county is used.
6)	Physicians	Doctors of medicine and doctors of osteopathy licensed with the N.C. Medical Board.
7)	Federal physician	Physician whose primary employer is the federal government and whose principal setting of primary practice is a health facility on a military installation, in a V.A. hospital, in the Public Health Service, in the Indian Health Service, or in another federal health facility. Federally-funded primary health care clinics serving the private sector are not considered a federal facility. Federal physicians are not required to be licensed by the N.C. Medical Board. Counts include only those federal physicians who hold active licenses from the North Carolina Medical Board.

Appendix III: Procedures for Requesting Additional Information

Procedures for Requesting Additional Information

This appendix describes the health professions information available through the North Carolina Health Professions Data System at the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research and the necessary procedures for obtaining data.

The Sheps Center maintains health professions data files through a cooperative effort with each licensing board for the following categories of health professionals licensed in North Carolina:

- Certified Nurse Midwives
- Chiropractors
- Dental Hygienists
- Dentists
- Nurses (RNs and LPNs)
- Nurse Practitioners
- Occupational Therapists
- Occupational Therapy Assistants
- Optometrists
- Pharmacists
- Physical Therapists
- Physical Therapist Assistants
- Physicians, includes MDs and DOs licensed by the North Carolina Medical Board
- Physicians in Residency Training
- Physician Assistants
- Podiatrists
- Practicing Psychologists
- Psychological Associates
- Respiratory Therapists

Although the Sheps Center does have files for each year since 1975²⁴, the data prior to 1979 are relatively inaccurate, and therefore their use is discouraged.

Health professionals provide the data to the respective licensing boards at the time of initial license or renewal. The data are tabulated by the Sheps Center, but at all times remain the property of the boards. The data are confidential because they include detailed information on the individuals licensed.

²⁴ Certified nurse midwife data are available starting from 1985; respiratory therapist data are available starting from 2004. Occupational therapist and occupational therapy assistant data are available starting from 2006.

Therefore, any requests for names, addresses, or other information that would lead to identification of any individuals cannot be honored without the prior written approval of the appropriate licensing board.

Data are provided in several formats: electronic mailing lists, cross-tabulations, frequencies and graphic representations. A two-week interval is normally required to process data requests, with a minimum charge dependent upon the type of output. Please visit the Health Professions Data System web site at http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp for more information.

When board approval is necessary, the following steps should be taken:

- 1. Contact the Sheps Center's N.C. Health Profession Data System Coordinator by phone (919) 966-7112, email (nchp@unc.edu) or letter to discuss the details or your request. Direct verbal or written approval from the executive officer of the appropriate board is required before any data can be released by the Sheps Center.
- 2. A letter should be sent to the executive officer of the appropriate board (see list on following pages) explaining the need for the data in question, and the preferred format of the data. If the data are for an announcement or a survey, a copy of the brochure or questionnaire to be sent is usually helpful. The letter should request that approval be granted to the Sheps Center to provide the data. Sending a copy of the letter to the Sheps Center Coordinator is recommended.

Board approval is normally not required if the data requested do not identify individuals. For requests of this type only a letter, email or telephone call to the Coordinator is required. A phone call is helpful to ensure that your request is clear.

If data are required immediately, the request should indicate the urgency. An urgent request will be processed as soon as it can be scheduled into the workload, and an additional charge will be assessed. However, no assurance can be given as to delivery date earlier than two weeks after the request has been received. Whenever possible, a two-week interval should be anticipated for the processing of routine requests; a longer period will be required if extensive programming is needed.
