Introduction

This is the thirty-seventh annual report on North Carolina health professions prepared using data compiled by the North Carolina Health Professions Data System (HPDS). The HPDS was developed to collect and disseminate timely and reliable data on licensed health professionals in North Carolina. Initiated in 1975 with federal funding from the National Center for Health Statistics, the HPDS was assisted in the early 1980s by a grant from the Duke Endowment through the North Carolina Hospital Association. Although selected data are available beginning in 1976, continuous and equivalent data files have been maintained since 1979. For most professional education, practice specialty, activity status, form of employment, and practice setting. Special analyses and reports from all data files may be requested (*see Appendix III*).

This report draws on data compiled and maintained by the North Carolina HPDS and describes the supply and distribution in 2014 of licensed individuals in nineteen health professions by county and selected regions. The HPDS is maintained by the Program on Health Workforce Research and Policy at the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Support for the HPDS is provided by the North Carolina Area Health Education Centers (NC AHEC) Program and the University of North Carolina Office of the Provost (Health Affairs). This report would not be possible without the cooperation of the independent health professions licensing boards that provide data to the HPDS.

Sources and Limitations of the Data

Source of Health Professions Data

Data for this report are provided annually by the licensing boards for each of the following professions: certified nurse midwives, chiropractors, dental hygienists, dentists, licensed practical nurses, nurse practitioners, occupational therapists, occupational therapy assistants, optometrists, pharmacists, physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, physicians, physician assistants, podiatrists, practicing psychologists, psychological associates, registered nurses and respiratory therapists. The boards provide demographic, practice, and location information on every professional licensed to practice in the state of North Carolina. This year, and for the past thirty-six years, this report has been prepared using data current to October 31 for each year, enabling users to construct longitudinal analyses and to examine yearly changes in health professionals over time.

Physician data are derived from the NC Medical Board's licensure files. These data include physicians who are currently in postgraduate medical training programs (residencies and fellowships) and have permanent licenses. In an effort to accurately separate physicians in residency training from those who are not in residency training, listings of physicians in postgraduate medical education

programs as of July 2014 were obtained from North Carolina residency program institutions. These lists were compared with the NC Medical Board's licensing file. Physicians in residency training are not included in the counts by county in this publication. Physicians in fellowship training are included in those counts. Resident physicians enrolled in postgraduate medical education programs were identified and are reported in Table 1.

Beginning in 2008, data on nurse practitioners (NPs) were acquired from the NC Board of Nursing; nurse practitioner data in prior years (1979-2007) were obtained from the NC Medical Board. The NC Midwifery Joint Committee provided data on certified nurse midwives (CNMs) for 2012. Data for physician assistants (PAs) were obtained from the NC Medical Board. Certified nurse midwives and nurse practitioners are included in the registered nurse (RN) counts.

Definitions and Limitations

Since state law requires a license to practice in each of the included professions, the data reported here reflect an accurate record of the supply and distribution of licensed practitioners. However, due to the fact that the actual activity status of a given professional may change over time (i.e. the person may retire, move out of the state but maintain a license, or maintain a license while working in another profession), having a license does not always indicate that the individual is actively practicing. To adjust for this, the data presented in this report include only those individuals who indicated on their license registration renewal form that they were working in North Carolina and were actively engaged in the profession. Active status practitioners may include administrators, researchers and educators who are active in the profession but are not engaged in direct patient care. Active status is assigned to individuals who are newly licensed and have not reported their status. Those with unknown activity status often include newly licensed professionals who at the time of licensure had not yet secured employment in their profession. Individuals who report a business address or hours but who do not report their status are also assigned an active status.¹ For active professionals, individuals are assigned to their selfdesignated primary practice location county, if their primary practice location is unknown, their county is assigned using their mailing address. For physicians, county is derived from the physician's practice ZIP code; for all other professions, counties are self-reported by the licensee on their registration form. The nursing professions (registered nurses, certified nurse midwives, nurse practitioners, and licensed practical nurses) and the dental professions (dentists and dental hygienists) are grouped together in the region and county pages. Physicians are listed separately from other professions. The remaining professions are listed in alphabetical order.

For the purpose of this report, doctors of medicine (MDs) and doctors of osteopathy (DOs), both of whom register with the NC Medical Board, are grouped together. The physician data reported in this publication are for non-resident licensed physicians who are not currently participating in one of the postgraduate medical education programs listed in Table 1. Fellows are included in physician counts.

Data in this report identify physicians employed by the federal government. Physicians included in the federal category have reported that their principal employer is the federal government. These

individuals may have primary practice settings in a health facility on a military installation, or in the Department of Veterans Affairs, U.S. Public Health Service, Indian Health Service, or some other federal health program or facility. Because their practices are in community settings, all National Health Service Corps (NHSC) physicians are included in the non-federal category except for uniformed Public Health Service physicians who may be in a NHSC placement. The NC Medical Board supplied the federal physician data reported in this document. Physicians employed by the federal government and practicing in federal institutions such as the Veterans Administration or Department of Defense facilities are not required to be licensed in North Carolina, so the numbers for federal physicians reported in this publication may fall short of the actual numbers of federal physicians in the state.

Beginning in 2003, physicians indicating non-federal status were checked against their primary practice setting. Physicians who indicated non-federal status but whose primary practice address was in a military setting were reclassified as federal physicians. Federal providers are not asked to specify their specific employment setting on the annual registration renewal form; therefore, military practitioners cannot be subcategorized within the federal category.

The NC Board of Nursing requires biennial registration in the birth month for the state's registered nurses (RNs) and licensed practical nurses (LPNs) with half of the state's RNs and LPNs registering with the Board each year. Therefore, the report includes updated data on the 50% of RNs and LPNs who renewed their registration in 2014, and data for the remaining 50% who renewed their registration in their birth month of the previous year. In October 2013, the NC Board of Nursing transitioned to the National Council of States Boards of Nursing NURSYS license verification system. This transition has changed the data available for all nurses in the HPDS beginning in 2014, as codes for variables such as type of position, employment setting, and major clinical practice area have been changed to reflect the NURSYS national standard. Data from nurses who registered in 2013 and were not required to reregister until 2015 were not carried forward, so 50% of the nurses included in the 2014 data have missing values for the new NURSYS variables. The changes do not affect county counts reported in this databook, but do affect data available in our nursing analysis files. Finally, when data were transferred into the NURSYS system from the NCBON, there was a transmission error that converted roughly half of the codes for gender from male to female. The Board has since corrected this error. HPDS programmers ran checks to compare genders between 2013 and 2014, and pulled forward 2013 gender into the 2014 file when data were discordant.

Like the NC Board of Nursing, the NC Psychology Board requires biennial registration. Both the Board of Nursing and the Psychology Board update their data in non-renewal years to reflect address changes, new licensees and deceased practitioners.

During the process of programming the 2014 dentist files, HPDS staff discovered an error in the programming process that inadvertently dropped dentists from the file who reported a nine-digit zip code for the University of North Carolina. This error in programming had been pulled forward since 2003, and dropped 42 dentists that should have entered the file as active, practicing in-state between 2003 and 2013. As a result, Orange County appears to have gained a large number of dentists between 2013 and 2014, when in reality these dentists entered active practice in the state over the ten-year period. No other counties in North Carolina were affected by the programming error.

During the process of creating the 2014 databook, HPDS staff discovered an error in the county and regional pages (pages 28-158) in the 2013 HPDS databook. Data for physicians practicing pediatrics and OBGYN were flipped, such that the numbers for pediatricians in each county reflected the number of obstetrician /gynecologists and vice versa. The 2013 databook was the only version of the databook affected by the error. Understanding the Supply of Physicians: Classifying by Area of Practice or Specialty

In 2011, the North Carolina Health Professions Data System (HPDS) reported that the number of primary care physicians practicing in the state dropped from 9,017 in 2010 to 7,520 in 2011 (NC HPDS 2011). This decline, the report explained, was due to a change in how each physicians' specialty was collected on the licensure renewal form by the North Carolina Medical Board. The change was intended to more accurately capture the "area of practice" in which physicians are actively practicing medicine, as opposed to the specialty in which they were trained or practiced in the past. The language on the renewal web site reads:

An area of practice is what you primarily do as a physician. Your area of practice may correspond to an ABMS/AOA certification or generally recognized area of work, e.g. "hospitalist," "administrative medicine," "integrative medicine," "student health" and so forth. Please elect all of your area(s) of practice and the designate one of them as your primary area of practice.

This change in reporting captures the "progressive specialization" of physicians as their practice changes after residency training and during their career in response to the needs of their patients, the communities in which they practice and their individual preferences. For the first time in 2011, North Carolina physicians, both MD and DO, were asked to indicate in which of 126 areas of practice they were engaged. In prior years, they were offered a listing of specialties to choose from that was similar to the listing of specialties published by the American Medical Association and used in their Physician Masterfile® to categorize physicians. Respondents could indicate multiple specialties but, if there were more than one, they were asked to identify the "primary specialty."

The most immediate and concerning effect of this change to reporting area of practice was the drop in the number of physicians classified as primary care. Compared to 2010 HPDS data, the number of primary care physicians in 2011 file apparently decreased by 16.6%, and the number of physicians in other specialties increased by 17.8%. The drop in primary care was due primarily to a shift in the selfdesignated area of practice from internal medicine to hospitalist by 471 physicians, from family practice to hospitalist by 42 physicians, and from family practice or internal medicine to administrative medicine by 140 physicians. The number of self-designated hospitalists grew from 81 in 2010 to 581 in 2011, those indicating administrative medicine grew from 15 to 188, and "urgent care" from 5 to 105. These and other shifts made the apparent supply of primary care physicians drop precipitously from a trend that had shown steady growth over the previous two decades. This apparent trend caused some concern to outside observers. The confusion is understandable given the shift in designation and reporting. However, to characterize the NC physician primary care physician supply as declining would misrepresent actual trends. There was a growth in the number of physicians-to-population between 2012 and 2013 of 1.8%, which was above the average annual physicians net growth per population of 1.2% since 2001. In short, MD growth has been twice as fast as population growth for the past decade and included in this overall growth has been an increase in the number of physicians providing primary care in the state.

In 2012, one year after the change had been implemented, the number of primary care physicians classified by specialty appeared to continue to decrease but only by small increments with 103 fewer family physicians and 101 fewer internists. In pediatrics, there was actually an increase of 86 general pediatricians from 2011 to 2012. For physician supply overall, there was once again a significant increase of 566 physicians in 2012, compared to the previous year.

In 2013, the apparent decreases continued with those designating family practice as their "area of practice" dropping by 400 and internal medicine, 137. The trend toward physicians who once would have reported they were in primary care selecting another area of practice continued as 1,828 practicing physicians reported working as "Hospitalists", or in "Urgent Care", "Student Health" and "Integrative Medicine". All four of these practice areas were added to the options for areas of practice during the transition period, and were not on the list of specialties available in 2010. Sixty-seven percent of physicians who selected one of these four areas of practice also listed a primary board certification in a primary care specialty. If the American Board of Medical Specialty (ABMS) board certifications were

used to describe the primary care physician workforce in the state instead of self-reported primary area of practice, then the growth in the primary care workforce in North Carolina would have continued proportionately to overall physician growth, or even slightly faster.

If physicians continue to be identified by their self-reported area of practice as opposed to their specialty or their board certification, this will disrupt the analysis of physician supply trends not just in the HPDS, but in North Carolina in general and in the U.S., especially for primary care. This disruption may cause confusion in policy discussions over the way to meet the nation's physician workforce needs. At present, there is no perfect mechanism to guide assignment of specialty and specialty groups to physicians. If primary care continues to be a designation relevant to policy—such as it used in the determination of Health Professional Shortage Areas, or eligibility for bonus payments and loan repayment support—we must carefully examine and be explicit about the taxonomy by which we classify specialties.

Beginning with 2014 data, the NC HPDS includes the following generalist specialties within the definition of primary care:

- Family Practice
- General Practice
- Geriatrics
- Internal Medicine
- Obstetrics & Gynecology
- Pediatrics
- Adolescent Medicine
- Medicine/Pediatrics
- Family Practice- Geriatric
- Family Practice, Sports Medicine
- Pediatric Sports Medicine
- Family Medicine/ Hospice & Palliative
- Geriatric Medicine/Internal Medicine
- Med/OBGYN
- Hospitalist
- Urgent Care
- Integrative Medicine
- Student Health

This definition of primary care includes all areas of practice that branch from family medicine to be inclusive of physicians who have the potential to provide full scope primary care, even though they may have certifications in additional areas, e.g. sports medicine.

The 2014 definition differs from the generalist definition of primary care used in the 2013 HPDS databook. The 2013 primary care generalist definition included administrative medicine and hospice & palliative medicine, and did not include medicine/pediatrics, family practice-sports medicine, pediatric sports medicine, family medicine/hospice & palliative, geriatric medicine/internal medicine, and medicine/OBGYN. The 2013 generalist primary care definition was based on an analysis of how physicians with an initial primary care specialty reclassified themselves into an area of practice, while the 2014 definition is based on the content of the area of practice.

Population Data

The 2014 population data estimates reported in this publication were downloaded from the North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management (http://www.osbm.state.nc.us/ncosbm/facts_and_figures/socioeconomic_data/population_estimates.shtm). The 2014 practitioner per 10,000 population ratios were calculated using these population estimates.

Demographic and Economic Data

This publication includes additional health, vital statistics and socio-demographic data. A list of the variable names, numbers, definitions, and the source of data by variable number can be found in *Appendix II: Definition of Terms*. All data provided in this publication are also available online at http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp/. Updated 2014 vital statistics data on pregnancy rates were not available at the time of databook publication, and in those cases 2013 data were used. The infant mortality rates reported in the 2014 state totals, non-Metropolitan/Metropolitan counties, Area Health Education Centers, Health Service Areas, the Department of Environment, Health and Natural Resources, and the Perinatal Care regions are computed as a one year rate.

This publication reports the number of general hospital discharges in 2014 from acute care, short-stay hospitals by county of patient residence. Any records with DRG 795 (normal newborn delivery) were omitted. Discharges from non-acute facilities such as psychiatric, rehabilitation, long term care, and substance abuse treatment facilities were omitted.

Summary of Trends in North Carolina Health Professional Supply

The overall number of health professionals in North Carolina grew by approximately 5.1% from November 2013 to October 2014. Table 3 summarizes the number of health professionals licensed in the past two years and the percent change in those numbers between 2014 and 2013.

CHANGES IN SUPPLY

Physicians




Figure 1: Annual Percent Growth in Physicians, Physician Assistants (PAs), and Nurse Practitioners (NPs), 2001-2014

The number of **physicians** licensed by the NC Medical Board between 2013 and 2014 grew 2.9% (+649), remaining constant with the rate of growth in 2012-2013 (+2.9%, +626) (Figure 1). In 2014, only two counties in the state, Tyrrell and Camden, did not have a physician reporting their primary practice location in that county. Warren county has one physician, while Gates and Hyde counties have two physicians each. Fifty-nine counties experienced an increase in the number of physicians, thirteen had no change in supply, and twenty-eight counties lost physicians. Counties with the largest percentage growth in the supply of physicians between 2013 and 2014 included Gates (+1, +100%), Hyde (+1, +100%), and Perquimans (+1, +33.3%). The largest numeric growth was observed in Mecklenburg (+121, +4.2%), Forsyth (+79, +4.4%), and Wake (+76, +3.3%) counties. The largest numeric reduction was in Haywood county (-12, -11.5%). Clay and Graham counties have the largest percentage decrease (-20.0%) each losing one physician.

Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, and Certified Nurse Midwives

This year's 4.0% (+184) increase in **physician assistants** (PAs) indicates a smaller increase in growth for the profession compared with the 2013 growth of 13.9%. In 2014, forty-three counties expanded their PA supply. The largest numeric increase was in Mecklenburg county (+52, 9.6%) and the largest percent increase was in Washington county (+3, 150%). Twenty-seven counties experienced no change in their PA supply and thirty counties experienced decreases in their PA supply. Two counties had no PAs in 2014: Camden and Tyrrell.²

The 14.4% (+676) expansion in the **nurse practitioner** (NP) numbers in 2014 marked twenty years of annual growth. Camden and Perquimans counties did not have a nurse practitioner in 2014.³ Gates dropped from one NP to zero in 2014, while Tyrrell county has had a single NP since 1993. In total, sixty-one counties increased their supply of NPs, twenty-six lost NPs, and thirteen experienced no change.

Figure 1 shows the annual growth for physicians, physician assistants (PAs), and nurse practitioners (NPs) over the past ten years, with both professions experiencing steady rates of increase from 2003-2007. From 2008 onward, the rate of growth in the number of PAs and NPs has remained relatively steady until 2012, when both NPs and PAs showed a slight decline in annual growth. In 2013 both professions experienced large increases in the number of professionals. NPs experienced substantial growth in 2014, while the PA growth rate, though still an increase, slowed in comparison to 2013. On the whole, the increase in the number of physicians from 2001-2014 has remained relatively steady, hovering between 2% and 3% most years.


The state's **certified nurse midwives** (CNMs) data showed a decrease (-11, -4.2%) in supply between 2013 and 2014. Overall, fifteen counties saw their CNM supply rise, sixty-six experienced no change, and nineteen counties lost CNMs. Beaufort, Duplin, Halifax, Harnett, Mitchell, Nash, Stanley, and Washington counties each lost all their CNMs; while Chowan, Dare, Lincoln, and Macon county each gained a CNM.⁴ Fifty counties in North Carolina had no CNMs in 2014.


Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses

The **registered nurse** (RN) data showed a 5.4% (+5,385) rise in the number of RNs in the state between 2013 and 2014 (Figure 2). Eighty-three counties expanded their RN supply in 2014 and seventeen counties experienced a loss in the number of RNs. Consistent with the past several years, Mecklenburg had the greatest number of RNs, with 11,700 active in the county. Wake county saw the largest numeric gain in RNs (+834, 8.0%), while Perquimans county saw the greatest percentage gain in RNs (+15, +88.2%) Tyrrell county had the fewest number of active RNs (13), followed by Camden (23) and Gates (27). Avery county had the greatest percentage loss in RN supply between 2013 and 2014 (-38, -28.8%).

The supply of **licensed practical nurses** (LPNs) increased by 6.1 % (+1,103) between 2013 and 2014. Seventy-five counties increased their numbers of LPNs, eighteen counties lost LPNs and seven counties did not show any change. Camden experienced the greatest percentage gain (+8, 100%) and Avery had the greatest percentage loss (-16, -42.1%).






Dentists and Dental Hygienists

Between 2013 and 2014, North Carolina experienced a 4.4% (+198) increase in its supply of **dentists** (Figure 3). Thirty-eight counties saw an increase in their dentist supply, thirty- two had no changes, and thirty lost dentists between 2013 and 2014. Camden, Hyde, and Tyrrell remained the only three counties in the state without a dentist indicating a primary practice location in one of those counties. The largest numeric increase in supply was in Orange county (+91, 65.9%). Per the note on limitations on page 5, the majority of this increase was due to discovery of a programming error that dropped dentists reporting a business address with a nine-digit University of North Carolina zip code from the data from 2003 to 2013. No other counties were affected by this error. The largest numeric decrease occurred in Durham county (-12, -5.9%) while the largest percentage decrease was observed in Chatham county (-10, -43.5%).

In 2013, there was a 2.3% (+132) rise in the number of **dental hygienists** registered with the Board of Dental Examiners. This increase was slightly smaller than the increase seen in 2013 (3.2%). Forty-four counties showed growth in their supply of dental hygienists during 2014, while forty counties experienced a decrease. Sixteen counties had no change in the number of hygienists in 2014. Swain observed the largest percent increase (+2, +40%). Cumberland and Onslow saw the largest numeric decrease (-12) while Wake county had the largest numeric increase (+68, +10.4%). All counties had one or more active hygienists in 2014.





Pharmacists




Figure 4: Annual Percent Growth in Pharmacists, 2001-2014

The total number of **licensed pharmacists** showed an increase of 5.2% (+502) between 2013 and 2014 (Figure 4). In the 2014 file, the supply of pharmacists grew in fifty-six counties. Wake experienced the largest numerical increase (+143, 11.2%), while Macon experienced the largest percentage increase of 130.8% with the addition of seventeen pharmacists. In 2014, Hyde was the only county without a pharmacist indicating a primary practice location. Thirty-three counties lost pharmacists. The largest reduction in numbers occurred in Lenoir (-24, -22.4%), while Martin county (-8, -34.8%) had the largest percentage decrease in 2014. Eleven counties had no change in the number of pharmacists.

Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants




Figure 5: Annual Percent Growth in Physical Therapists (PTs) and Physical Therapist Assistants (PTAs), 2001-2014

Between 2013 and 2014, the supply of licensed **physical therapists** (PTs) grew 7.8% (+424) (Figure 5). Forty-two counties expanded their supply of PTs, forty counties lost PTs, and eighteen counties had no change. The biggest percentage gain was seen in Jones (+6, +300%). Wake saw the highest numeric gain in PTs (+75, +10.1%). Camden (-1) and Caswell (-5) each lost all of the county's PTs. Chatham saw the largest numeric loss in PTs (-18, -46.2%). Camden, Caswell, Gates, and Tyrrell were the only counties in 2014 without a PT. The number of **physical therapist assistants** (PTAs) increased 5.9% (+143) in 2014. Forty-three counties expanded their supply of PTAs, thirty-six lost PTAs, and twenty-one counties had no change in PTA numbers. Wake county experienced the largest numerical gain in PTAs (+35, +28.2%) while Edgecombe and Union lost the greatest number of PTAs (-7). Warren, who lost the county's only active PTA, joined Camden, Gates, and Tyrell as counties without active PTAs.

Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy Assistants




Figure 6: Annual Percent Growth in Occupational Therapists (OTs) and Occupational Therapy Assistants (OTAs), 2006-2014

Occupational therapists (OTs) experienced a 3.6% (+105) increase between 2013 and 2014 (Figure 6). Forty-eight counties gained OTs, twenty-nine lost OTs, and twenty-three counties experienced no change. Graham county lost its only OT, joining Caswell, Hyde, and Tyrell counties as the four counties in the state without an OT. Iredell and Pitt county had the greatest numeric loss (-5) in OT supply. Wake county had the greatest numeric gain in OTs (+28, +7.7%). In 2014, the supply of **occupational therapy assistants** (OTAs) increased by 4.0% (+55). Thirty-nine counties gained OTAs, twenty-eight counties lost OTAs, and thirty-three counties experienced no change. Camden and Tyrrell were the only counties in 2014 without an OTA. Swain county had the highest percentage decrease in OTA supply (-3, -75%), while Burke county experienced the highest numeric loss (-7, -19.4%). Mecklenburg county saw the highest numeric gain in OTAs (+9, +7.1%), while Perquimans observed the highest percentage gain (+2, +200%).




Figure 7: Annual Percent Change in Psychologists and Psychological Associates, 2001-2014

The number of **practicing psychologists** in North Carolina increased 0.4% (+4) between 2013 and 2014 (Figure 7). Twenty-six counties did not have a practicing psychologist in 2013 and nineteen counties had only one psychologist. Overall, thirty-seven counties lost psychologists, thirty-seven counties had no change in numbers and twenty-six counties gained psychologists. Durham county had the largest numeric increase in psychologists (+33, +11.4%). Guilford county lost the most psychologists (-10, -9.5%). Between 2013 and 2014, the supply of **psychological associates** declined by 6.2% (-55). Overall, forty-four counties lost psychological associates, nineteen counties gained psychological associates, and thirty-seven counties saw no change. Nineteen counties had no psychological associates, two of which, (Transylvania and Warren), lost their only psychological associate between 2013 and 2014. Sixteen counties only had one psychological associate in 2014. Wake county had the largest numeric growth in psychological associates (+10, +10.3%). Buncombe county lost the largest numeric growth in psychological associates (-8,-20%).

Psychologists and Psychological Associates

Podiatrists, Optometrists and Chiropractors

North Carolina saw a slight increase in the **podiatry** workforce supply between 2013 and 2014 (+4, +1.4%). Eight counties lost podiatrists, while eighty-one counties saw no change in podiatrist supply. Eleven counties saw increases in podiatrists, including Davie county, which gained a podiatrist in 2014 after having none in 2013. Forty counties had no podiatrists in 2014 and twenty-three counties had only one.

The state's **optometrist** workforce expanded by 2.0% (+23) in 2014. Twenty-nine counties gained providers, nineteen lost providers, and fifty-two experienced no change. Twelve counties had no optometrists in 2014. Eleven counties had only one optometrist. Lenoir county all had the largest percentage gain in optometrists (+3, +75%) and Guilford county gained the greatest number of optometrists (+6, +12 %). Onslow and Johnston counties lost the greatest number of optometrists between 2013 and 2014 (-4).

The state **chiropractor** workforce saw a rise in supply between 2013 and 2014 (+29, +1.8%). In 2014, Twenty-eight counties increased their number of chiropractors, twenty lost chiropractors, and fifty-two experienced no change. Twelve counties had no chiropractors; Guilford and Mecklenburg saw the largest loss in the number of chiropractors (-7). Eleven counties had only one chiropractor. Granville and Harnett county saw the largest percentage increase in chiropractors (+50%), while Wake county had the largest numeric growth (+18, 7.6%).

Respiratory Therapists

The number of **respiratory therapists** (RTs) in North Carolina saw a surge in workforce numbers for 2014 (+231,+ 5.8%) after seeing a decrease in supply from 2012 to 2013 (-184, -4.4%). In 2014, fifty-nine counties gained RTs, six lost RTs, and thirty-five had no change. Of the fifteen counties that had no RTs in 2013, eleven lacked an active RT in 2014. Caswell, Clay, Currituck, and Madison counties all gained a respiratory therapist after previously having none in 2013. Alamance, Beaufort, Franklin, Lincoln, Polk, and Vance counties had the largest decrease in RT supply (-1). Hoke (+4, +50%) saw the largest percentage increase, while Wake county saw the largest numeric increase (+25, +9.4%).

CHANGES IN PRACTITIONER TO POPULATION RATIOS

North Carolina's population increased 1.0% between 2013 and 2014, the same growth rate seen for the previous two time periods, 2011-2012 and 2012-2013.⁵ Any examination of the changes in the supply and distribution of the health care workforce must take into account North Carolina's population growth rate, as well as the differences in population growth rates across counties of the state. To account for these factors, changes in health professional supply are illustrated in this section by examining the number of health care professionals per 10,000 people.⁶ The practitioner per 10,000 population ratio provides a better metric to compare the supply and distribution of health professionals across varying geographic areas than the use of simple raw counts. Tables 4 through 14 (excluding Table 6) include the ten highest and lowest ranked North Carolina counties based on active physicians, primary care physicians, registered nurses, dentists, and pharmacists per 10,000 population.

Table 6 provides the physician and primary care physician ratios per 10,000 population based on American Medical Association (AMA) data for the United States, North Carolina, and selected states that border North Carolina. Caution should be used in comparing these figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the data book because of differences in the data collection and reporting efforts at the AMA.

Table 15 shows the practitioner per 10,000 population ratios for all North Carolina counties in alphabetical order. As in Table 4, licensed professionals for whom activity status is "unknown" are included in the "active" category. Professionals are only counted once and are located in counties based on primary practice location.

Physicians per 10,000 Population Ratio

The 2014 ratio of North Carolina's physicians per 10,000 population was 23.2, a slight increase from the 2013 ratio (22.7). The counties with the ten largest and ten smallest ratios in 2014 are included in Tables 4 and 5.

According to data from the AMA and the U.S. Census Bureau, as seen in Table 6, there were, on average, about 24 physicians per 10,000 population in the United States in 2013. (The 2013 data are the most recent national data available in the Health Services and Resources Administration's 2014-2015 Area Health Resource File.) According to these data, North Carolina has 22.2 physicians per 10,000 inhabitants, slightly lower than the national average. Compared to adjacent states, North Carolina has fewer physicians per 10,000 population than Tennessee and Virginia, but more physicians per population than Georgia and South Carolina. As mentioned earlier, the county- and state-level ratios using the NC Medical Board data are difficult to compare with the AMA figures due to differences in methodology and timing of data collection and reporting. According to the national AMA data (see Table 6), there were 8.4 primary care physicians per 10,000 population in the United States in 2013 and 8.1 primary care physicians per 10,000 population than North Carolina. Tennessee had a larger number of primary care physicians per 10,000 population than North Carolina (with a ratio of 8.3) and Georgia, South Carolina, and Virginia all had smaller ratios (7.7, 7.7, and 7.4, respectively).

Primary Care Physicians⁸ per 10,000 Population Ratio

According to NC HPDS data, there were 8.6 primary care physicians per 10,000 population in North Carolina in 2014, which shows no change from 2013 (8.6). Tables 7 and 8 illustrate the counties with the largest and the smallest primary care physicians per 10,000 population ratios.

North Carolina had 4.7 dentists per 10,000 population in 2014, only a fraction higher than the ratio in 2013 (4.6). National statistics show a ratio of 5.7 dentists per 10,000 population for the U.S. in 2014.⁹ Caution should be used in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book

Registered Nurses per 10,000 Population Ratio

North Carolina's ratio for registered nurses (RNs) per 10,000 population increased slightly from 101.0 in 2013 to 105.5 in 2014. The state's supply of RNs per 10,000 population is greater than the 2014 national statistic of 90.7 RNs per 10,000 population. Caution should be used in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book because of differences in the data collection efforts of

Pharmacists per 10,000 Population Ratio

On average, the state had 10.6 licensed pharmacists per 10,000 population in 2014, a slight change from 10.2 in 2013. The national ratio is 8.7 licensed pharmacists per 10,000 population.¹¹ Again, the reader is cautioned to use care in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the data book because of differences in the data collection efforts of ProQuest LLC. See Tables 13 and 14 for the North Carolina counties ranking the highest and lowest pharmacists to population ratios.



NORTH CAROLINA MAPS: HEALTH PROFESSIONALS PER 10,000 POPULATION






Physician Assistants per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Nurse Practitioners per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Certified Nurse Midwives (CNMs) per 10,000 Women Ages 15-44 North Carolina, 2014


Registered Nurses per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Licensed Practical Nurses per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Dentists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Dental Hygienists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Chiropractors per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Occupational Therapists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Occupational Therapy Assistants per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Optometrists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Pharmacists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Physical Therapists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Physical Therapist Assistants per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Podiatrists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Psychologists per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014


Psychological Associates per 10,000 Population North Carolina, 2014

Appendix I: Technical Notes on Methods

This report is based on registration data obtained on selected licensed health professional categories within North Carolina between November 1, 2013 and October 31, 2014.

Data on the licensed health professionals profiled in this report were collected from both initial and renewal licensure forms by their respective licensing boards. All boards supplied computerized copies of their files containing all necessary data to the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research. All data files were run through a series of editing programs and procedures to check for inconsistencies.

Data were updated on a regular basis at each board with new licensees as well as changes in address. Physician data were checked and corrected for residency status using data supplied by hospitals with postgraduate medical education programs. Physicians are the only profession assigned to county location based on ZIP code information.

Counties for which teen pregnancy rates appear as an asterisk indicate that those data were suppressed by the North Carolina State Center for Health Statistics as rates based on fewer than 20 cases are considered unstable and were therefore not reported.

Population percentages appearing in the county and region pages may not add up to 100% due to rounding.

Appendix II: Definition of Terms

Health Professions Related

1)	Active	Licensed individuals who are currently practicing in their respective field.
2)	Inactive	Licensed individuals who are retired, employed in another field or otherwise not practicing in their respective field.
3)	Unknown Activity Status	Licensed individuals for whom practice status is not reported. Experience has shown that these usually are persons just entering their field. They are therefore considered active.
4)	In-State	Licensed individuals who practice in North Carolina if they are active or who reside in North Carolina if they are inactive. If business county is missing for active individuals, mailing county is used.
5)	Out-of-State	Licensed individuals who practice outside of North Carolina if they are active or who reside outside of North Carolina if they are inactive. If business county is missing for active individuals, mailing county is used.
6)	Physicians	Doctors of medicine and doctors of osteopathy licensed with the N.C. Medical Board.
7)	Federal physician	Physician whose primary employer is the federal government and whose principal setting of primary practice is a health facility on a military installation, in a V.A. hospital, in the Public Health Service, in the Indian Health Service, or in another federal health facility. Federally-funded primary health care clinics serving the private sector are not considered a federal facility. Federal physicians are not required to be licensed by the N.C. Medical Board. Counts include only those federal physicians who hold active licenses from the North Carolina Medical Board.

Appendix III: Procedures for Requesting Additional Information

Procedures for Requesting Additional Information

This appendix describes the health professions information available through the North Carolina Health Professions Data System at the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research and the necessary procedures for obtaining data.

The Sheps Center maintains health professions data files through a cooperative effort with each licensing board for the following categories of health professionals licensed in North Carolina:

- Certified Nurse Midwives
- Chiropractors
- Dental Hygienists
- Dentists
- Nurses (RNs and LPNs)
- Nurse Practitioners
- Occupational Therapists
- Occupational Therapy Assistants
- Optometrists
- Pharmacists
- Physical Therapists
- Physical Therapist Assistants
- Physicians, includes MDs and DOs licensed by the North Carolina Medical Board
- Physicians in Residency Training
- Physician Assistants
- Podiatrists
- Practicing Psychologists
- Psychological Associates
- Respiratory Therapists

Although the Sheps Center does have files for each year since 1975²³, the data prior to 1979 are relatively inaccurate, and therefore their use is discouraged.

Health professionals provide the data to the respective licensing boards at the time of initial license or renewal. The data are tabulated by the Sheps Center, but at all times remain the property of the boards. The data are confidential because they include detailed information on the individuals licensed. Therefore, any requests for names, addresses, or other information that would lead to identification of any individuals cannot be honored without the prior written approval of the appropriate licensing board.

Data are provided in several formats: electronic mailing lists, cross-tabulations, frequencies and graphic representations. A two-week interval is normally required to process data requests, with a minimum charge dependent upon the type of output. Please visit the Health Professions Data System web site at *http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp* for more information.

When board approval is necessary, the following steps should be taken:

- Contact the Sheps Center's NC Health Profession Data System by phone (919) 966-9985, email (nchp@unc.edu) or letter to discuss the details or your request. Direct verbal or written approval from the executive officer of the appropriate board is required before any data can be released by the Sheps Center.
- 2. A written request should be sent to the executive officer of the appropriate board (see list on following pages) explaining the need for the data in question, variables and years of data requested, and the preferred format of the data. If the data are for an announcement or a survey, a copy of the brochure or questionnaire to be sent is usually helpful. The letter should request that approval be granted to the Sheps Center to provide the data. If board approval is required, Sheps staff require a copy of approval in before data requests are filled.

Board approval is normally not required if the data requested do not identify individuals. For requests of this type only a letter, email or telephone call to the Sheps Center is required. A phone call is helpful to ensure that your request is clear.

If data are required immediately, the request should indicate the urgency. An urgent request will be processed as soon as it can be scheduled into the workload, and an additional charge will be assessed. However, no assurance can be given as to delivery date earlier than two weeks after the request has been received. If board approval is required, the two week period begins after the Sheps Center receives a copy of the approval letter. Whenever possible, a two-week interval should be anticipated for the processing of routine requests; a longer period will be required if extensive programming is needed.
