Objectives for RNDMU Workshop 2012

Monday Sessions

- Identify opportunities for investment and protections for FP in ACA
- Learn of “viable paths” for family planning providers and systems to take through health reform (without becoming a primary care provider)
- Understand CDC’s efforts to help document different dimensions of quality in FP services and why it is important to establish endorsed indicators
- Discuss which indicators related to the Title X program might be good for endorsement as standard measures of “high quality care”

Objectives for RNDMU Workshop 2012

Tuesday Sessions

- Assess what we know, and do not know about patterns of contraceptive use, and what we need to do about it
- Understand pregnancy motivations, fertility decision-making and the role of partners and providers in shaping women's RLPs
- Examine differences in how we ask about fertility intentions: wanting, trying, planning, hoping for pregnancy and childbearing
- Review results from other clinic surveys and different populations of women: how do the results compare?
- Identify existing options for tracking population-based measures of pregnancy motivation and RLPs and learn what are new opportunities on the horizon
- Discuss different views as to whether pregnancy ambivalence undermines our FP mission to prevent unintended pregnancy

- Identify validated clinical innovations to provide patients at high-risk of repeat unintended pregnancy with effective contraception
- Learn of new clinical approaches to “starting the FP and RLP conversations”
