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#### Introduction

This is the twenty-eighth annual report prepared from data collected by the N.C. Health Professions Data System (HPDS), formerly the Health Manpower Component of the North Carolina Cooperative Health Information System. The N.C. Health Professions Data System was developed to collect and disseminate timely and reliable data on licensed health professionals in North Carolina. The System was initiated in 1975 with federal funding from the National Center for Health Statistics and was assisted in the early 1980s by a grant from the Duke Endowment through the N.C. Hospital Association. Although selected data are available beginning in 1976, continuous and equivalent data files have been maintained since 1979. For most professions these data include name, mailing address, birth year, gender, race, information on basic professional education, specialty of practice, activity status, form of employment, and practice setting. Special analyses and reports from all data files may be requested (*see Appendix III*).

This report draws on data from the HPDS and describes the supply and distribution in 2005 of licensed individuals in seventeen health professions by county and selected regions. The HPDS is maintained by the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Support for the HPDS is provided by the N.C. Area Health Education Centers (NC AHEC) Program and the University of North Carolina Office of the Provost (Health Affairs). This report would not be possible without the cooperation of the independent health professions licensing boards that provide data to the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research.

#### Sources and Limitations of the Data

#### Source of Health Professions Data

Health professions data for this report are provided annually by the regulatory boards for each of the following professions: certified nurse midwives, chiropractors, dental hygienists, dentists, licensed practical nurses, nurse practitioners, optometrists, pharmacists, physical therapists, physical therapist assistants, physicians, physician assistants, podiatrists, practicing psychologists, psychological associates, registered nurses and respiratory therapists. The Boards provide demographic, practice, and location information on every professional licensed to practice in the state of North Carolina. This year, and for the past twenty-seven years, this annual report has been prepared using data files current up to October for the respective year; this makes it possible for users to perform longitudinal analyses and to examine yearly changes in health professionals over time.

Physician data are derived from the N.C. Medical Board's licensure files. These data contain physicians who are currently in postgraduate medical training programs but who have permanent licenses. In an effort to accurately separate physicians in residency training from those that are not in residency training, listings of physicians in postgraduate medical education programs as of July 2005 were obtained from all North Carolina residency program institutions. These lists were compared with the N.C. Medical Board's licensing file. Physicians in residency training are not included in the number of counts by county in this publication. All resident physicians enrolled in postgraduate medical education programs were identified and are reported in Table 1.

Source: Residency data are received annually from the respective residency programs and are based on the institutions' lists of house staff, residents and fellows as of July 2005.

The N.C. Midwifery Joint Committee provided data on certified nurse midwives (CNMs). Data for nurse practitioners (NPs) and physician assistants (PAs) were obtained from the N.C. Medical Board. Certified nurse midwives and nurse practitioners are included in the registered nurse (RN) counts because CNMs and NPs maintain their RN licensure with the N.C. Board of Nursing.

#### **Definitions and Limitations**

Because state law requires a license to practice for each of the professions profiled, the data reported reflect an accurate enumeration of the supply and distribution of licensed practitioners. However, because the actual activity status of a given professional may change over time (i.e. the person may retire, move out of the state but maintain a license, or maintain a license while working in another profession), having a license does not always indicate that the individual is actively practicing. To adjust for this, the data presented in this report include only those individuals who indicated on their license registration renewal form that they were working in North Carolina and were actively engaged in the profession. Active status may include administrators, researchers and educators who are active in the profession but not engaged in direct patient care. Active status is assigned to individuals who are newly licensed and have not reported their status. Those with unknown activity status often include newly licensed professionals who at the time of licensure had not yet secured employment in their profession. Those individuals who report a business address or hours but who do not report their status are also assigned an active status<sup>1</sup>. Health care professionals are assigned to their self-designated primary practice location county if they are active and to their mailing address county if they are active and their primary practice location is unknown. For physicians, this is based on ZIP code information; for all other professions, counties are identified by the professional on their licensure form. The nursing professions (registered nurses, certified nurse midwives, nurse practitioners, and licensed practical nurses) and the dental professions (dentists and dental hygienists) are grouped together in the region and county pages. Physicians are broken down separately. The remaining professions are listed in alphabetical order.

For the purpose of this report, doctors of medicine (MDs) and doctors of osteopathy (DOs), both of whom register with the N.C. Medical Board, are grouped together. Physicians are classified by specialty according to the self-reported primary specialty indicated on their Application for Registration with the N.C. Medical Board. Physicians whose primary and/or secondary specialty has changed since 2004 were checked against specialty data provided by the N.C. Medical Society. Physician data in this report are classified by residency-training status in 2005 and federal or non-federal employment status. The physician data reported in this publication are for non-resident licensed physicians who are not currently participating in one of the postgraduate medical education programs listed in Table 1.

Within the category of non-resident physicians are federal and non-federal physicians. Physicians included in the federal category have reported that their principal employer is the federal government.

<sup>1</sup> For physical therapists and physical therapy assistants, individuals who report that they are not actively employed in physical therapy but are seeking employment in physical therapy are also considered active. These are the only professions that have data available on whether individuals are seeking employment.

These individuals may have primary practice settings in a health facility in a military installation, Department of Veterans Affairs, U.S. Public Health Service, Indian Health Service, or other federal health facility. Because their practices are in community settings, all National Health Service Corps physicians are included in the non-federal category, except for uniformed Public Health Service physicians who may be in a Health Service Corps placement. The N.C. Medical Board supplied federal physician data reported in this document. Federal physicians practicing in government facilities are not required to be licensed by the N.C. Medical Board to practice medicine in North Carolina, so the numbers for federal physicians reported in this publication may fall short of the actual numbers of federal physicians in the state. Federal providers are not asked to specify their employment setting on the annual registration renewal form; therefore, military providers cannot be subcategorized within the federal providers category.

Beginning in 2003, physicians indicating non-federal status were checked against primary practice setting. Physicians who indicated non-federal status but whose primary practice address was in a military setting were reclassified as federal physicians.

The N.C. Board of Nursing requires biennial registration (on the birth month) for the state's registered nurses (RNs) and licensed practical nurses (LPNs) with half of the state's RNs and LPNs registering with the Board each year. Therefore, the report includes data on the 50% of RNs and LPNs who renewed their registration in 2005, and data for the remaining 50% who renewed their registration in their birth month. Additionally, the N.C. Psychology Board requires biennial registration. Both the Board of Nursing and the Psychology Board update their data in non-renewal years to reflect address changes and deceased practitioners.

#### Population Data

The 2005 projected population data reported in this publication were downloaded from Log Into North Carolina (LINC), the State Data Center's online data system (http://www.linc.state.nc.us) administered through the Office of State Budget and Management. The 2005 population data are projected numbers as the 2005 estimates were not available at the time of publication. The 2004 population figures are based on the April 1, 2000 Census. Ratios of health professionals reported are per 10,000 population.

#### Demographic and Economic Data

This publication includes additional health, vital statistics and socio-demographic data. The majority of these data are available online via the websites of the specific source agencies or through LINC. A list of the variable names, numbers, definitions, and the source of data by variable number can be found in *Appendix II: Definition of Terms*. All county and substate regional level health professions data provided in this publication are also available online at http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp. The infant mortality rates reported in the 2005 State Totals, Non-Metropolitan/Metropolitan counties, Area Health Education Centers, Health Service Areas, the Department of Environment, Health and Natural Resources,

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and the Perinatal Care regions are computed as a one year rate. Prior to 2003 the Data Book reported regional infant mortality based on a five year rate.

This publication reports the number of general hospital discharges in 2004 from acute care, short-stay hospitals by county of patient residence. The year 2005 general hospital discharges were not available at the time this report was compiled. 2004 data are reported. The data exclude normal newborn discharges (DRG 391). These data are made available through the LINC Data Base.

## Summary of Trends in North Carolina Health Professional Supply

The overall number of health professionals in North Carolina grew from November 2004 to October 2005. Table 2 below summarizes the number of health professionals licensed in the past two years and the percent change in those numbers between 2004 and 2005.



The majority of health professions saw moderate growth in 2005. The number of primary care physicians increased 3.5% (+259) from 2004 to 2005. Internal medicine (+110, 4.4%) and family practice (+76, 3.2%) physicians also expanded. This year, obstetrician-gynecologists (+7, 0.71%) showed only a very slight increase over 2004 numbers while there was another decrease in the number of general practitioners from 142 to 141 (-0.70%). The largest percentage increases in other health professions were seen by nurse practitioners (+184, 8.16%), physician assistants (+176, 7.05%), practicing psychologists (+90, +5.68%) and physical therapist assistants (+98, +5.57%). In 2005 there were moderate increases in the supply of physical therapists (+155, 4.31%), respiratory therapists (+135, 4.12%) and dentists (+144, +3.97%) and small increases in registered nurses (+2,180, 2.81%), certified nurse midwives (+3, +1.54%), licensed practical nurses (+42, +0.25%) and chiropractors (+2, +0.17%). Psychological associates (+6, +0.67%) showed an increase this year, reversing the downward trend of the previous four years while there were slight decreases in numbers of pharmacists (-2, -0.03%), optometrists (-3, -0.33%) and podiatrists (-4, -1.61%).

#### CHANGES IN SUPPLY

#### Physicians

Figure 1 depicts the annual growth, over the past 10 years, of the total number of active licensed **physicians** practicing in North Carolina, excluding those in residency training or employed by the federal government. The 3.15% (+546) growth of physicians licensed by the N.C. Medical Board between 2004 and 2005 is a departure from the slowing growth trend seen in previous years. This is the first year since 1998 that the growth in physicians has topped 3%.



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Prior to 1997, physician licensure renewal was a biennial process that, through 1994, was held in even-numbered years. In 1995, a switch was made to odd-numbered years. However, in 1997, licensure renewal became an annual process.

In 2005, every county in North Carolina had at least one physician reporting a primary practice location; the fewest were found in the following counties: Tyrrell (1), Hyde (1), Camden (1), Gates (1) and Perquimans (2). Fifty-two counties experienced an increase in the number of physicians, thirteen had no change in supply, and thirty-five counties lost physicians. Counties with the largest percentage growth in the supply of physicians between 2004 and 2005 include Greene (+2, 40.0%), Graham (+1, 33.3%), and Alexander, (+4, 30.8%). The largest reduction in numbers was in Lincoln County (-13, -22.8%) while the counties with the largest percentage decrease were Warren (-6, -66.7%), Camden (-2, -66.7%), and Gates (-2, -66.7%).

The supply of **primary care physicians**<sup>6</sup> in North Carolina increased at a slightly greater rate (3.5%) than the physician supply (3.15%) in 2005. The 2005 increase is significantly larger than the 1.9% growth rate for primary care physicians reported in 2004. The elevated growth rate is a departure from the trend of slowing growth that has occurred in the state since 1999 when primary care physicians posted a 5.2% increase (+332). Fifty-four counties increased their numbers of primary care physicians, with Jones (+6, 46.2%), Greene (+2, 40.0%), Franklin (+6, 40.0%), and Graham (+1, 33.3%) experiencing the largest percentage gains. Mecklenburg (+43, 5.7%) and Wake (+39, 5.9%) counties gained the most primary care physicians. The number of primary care physicians remained stable in eighteen counties, and twenty-eight counties had a reduction in supply. The largest numeric decrease was in Harnett County (-10, -21.3%).

Nurse Practitioners, Certified Nurse Midwives and Physician Assistants

The 8.2% (+184) expansion in the **nurse practitioner** (NP) numbers in 2005 marks eleven years of substantial annual growth. Alexander, Hyde, Jones, and Martin counties all gained at least one NP after having had none in the previous year. Two counties had no nurse practitioners (Camden and Gates)<sup>7</sup> and five counties had only one NP (Alexander, Alleghany, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Warren) in 2005. In total, fifty-one counties increased their supply of nurse practitioners, while thirty-five lost providers and fourteen experienced no change.

The state's **certified nurse midwives** (CNMs) data show a 1.5% (+3) increase in supply between 2004 and 2005, returning to a rising supply after a very slight decrease in numbers in 2004 (-1, -0.5%). Beaufort, Martin, Onslow, and Watauga counties each added one practitioner, for a 100% expansion in their CNM supply. Overall, thirteen counties saw their CNM supply rise, seventy-five experienced no change, and twelve counties lost providers<sup>8</sup>. Edgecombe and Lincoln each lost their sole CNM in 2005, in

addition to Sampson, which lost both of its CNMs. However, Duplin County gained two midwives after having none in 2004. The net result was that fifty-two counties in North Carolina had no CNMs in 2005, up from fifty in 2004.

This year's 7.0% (+176) increase in **physician assistants** (PAs) returns to the trend of substantial growth experienced since 1997, with the exception of a slight slowing in growth in 2004. In 2005, forty-five counties expanded their PA supply, with Polk County (+3) quadrupling its numbers. Warren lost both of its PAs and Tyrrell lost its sole provider. Twenty-three counties experienced no change in their PA supply, including four counties that had no PAs in 2004 or 2005 (Camden, Currituck, Hyde and Mitchell). Thirty-two counties decreased their PA supply.

#### Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses

The **registered nurses** (RN) data showed a 2.8% (+2,180) rise in numbers of RNs in the state between 2004 and 2005. In 2005, sixty-one counties expanded their RN supply. Two counties (Graham and Vance) had no change in their RN supply. RN numbers declined in thirty-seven counties with the largest percentage decrease in Alleghany county (-20, -26.3%). The largest numeric loss was in Rockingham county (-66, -12.3%).

The supply of **licensed practical nurses** (LPNs) grew slightly by 0.2% (+42) between 2004 and 2005. Forty-five counties increased their numbers of LPNs, forty-nine counties lost LPNs and six counties did not show any change. The largest percentage losses were in Caswell (-22, -53.7%) and Alleghany (-15, -51.7%). The largest reductions in number were in Forsyth (-60, -5.5%) and Wayne (-32, -10.9%).

#### Dentists and Dental Hygienists

Between 2004 and 2005, North Carolina experienced a 4.0% (+144) increase in its supply of dentists. Twenty-four counties showed reduced numbers of dentists between 2004 and 2005, thirty-one counties had no change in their supply of dentists, and forty-four counties saw their supply of dentists rise. The counties of Camden, Hyde, and Tyrell have not had a dentist indicating a primary practice location since 1995. Gates lost its sole dentist, bringing the total of counties without an active dentist to four. Bertie, Graham, Jones, and Northampton each have only one dentist.

In 2005, there was a 1.7% (+73) rise in the number of **dental hygienists** registered with the Board of Dental Examiners. Forty-eight counties showed growth in 2005 while thirty-five counties experienced a decrease in their supply of hygienists. There were seventeen counties with no change in their number of hygienists. In 2005, the largest percentage expansions were seen in Jones and Northampton, both of which added one provider for a 100.0% increase in supply. In 2005 the largest absolute gains occurred in Wake (+26, 5.7%) and Forsyth (+14, 7.7%). Two counties had only one hygienist with a primary practice location (Camden and Currituck) and four counties did not possess any (Bertie, Gates, Hyde and Tyrrell) in 2005.

#### **Pharmacists**

The number of licensed **pharmacists** (-2,-0.03%) changed very little from 2004 to 2005. The supply of pharmacists grew in forty counties, with Wake experiencing the largest raw number increase (+18, 2.3%). Alleghany and Swain had the largest positive percentage change (40.0%) with the addition of two pharmacists each. In 2005, Camden and Hyde were the only counties without a pharmacist indicating a practice in those jurisdictions. Forty-three counties lost pharmacists; the largest reduction in numbers occurred in Guilford (-33, -7.8%) and Wayne (-16, -17.4%). Yadkin lost six pharmacists for the largest percentage decrease (-37.5%), while seventeen counties had no change in numbers.

#### Physical Therapists and Physical Therapist Assistants

Between 2004 and 2005, the supply of licensed **physical therapists** (PTs) grew 4.3% (+155), less than last year's growth of 7.4% (+247). Fifty-one counties expanded their supply of PTs, nineteen lost PTs, and thirty counties had no change in numbers. Chowan, which lost both of its PTs in 2004, regained a sole provider in 2005. Four counties had no PTs in 2005 (Camden, Gates, Perquimans, and Tyrrell). The number of **physical therapist assistants** (PTAs) increased 5.6% (+98) in 2005, continuing a trend of rising growth since 2001. Forty-nine counties expanded their supply of PTAs, twenty-three lost PTAs, and twenty-eight counties had no change in numbers. Hoke (+3) and Jones (+2) each doubled their supply of PTAs. Warren regained two providers, after losing its sole PTA in 2004. Camden, Clay and Tyrrell have not had any PTAs since 2003.

#### Psychologists and Psychological Associates

The number of **practicing psychologists** in North Carolina increased 5.7% (+90) between 2004 and 2005. This figure is larger than the growth experienced in previous years, and comes after a 2.6% decrease in supply in 2004. There were twenty-five counties without a practicing psychologist in 2005 and fifteen counties had only one psychologist. During 2005, four counties lost psychologists (Cabarrus, Nash, Rowan, and Watauga), sixty-eight counties had no change in numbers and twenty-eight counties gained practicing psychologists. During 2005, the supply of **psychological associates** increased (+6, 0.67%), after reaching its lowest number in a decade in 2004. Overall, twenty-six counties lost psychological associates and sixteen counties had none in 2005. Three counties (Polk, Stokes, and Warren) lost their sole provider and Brunswick lost all three of its providers. Forty-three counties experienced no change, and thirty-one gained psychological associates. Seventeen counties had only one provider. Buncombe experienced the largest numeric decrease (-12, -19.0%) whereas Jackson had the highest numeric gain (+4, 40.0%).

#### *Podiatrists, Optometrists and Chiropractors*

In 2004, the **podiatry** workforce experienced a slight decrease (-4, -1.6%). Seven counties gained podiatrists, including Sampson (+2) which had no podiatrists in 2003 and 2004. Nine counties lost podiatrists, and eighty-four had no change in numbers. Forty-two counties had no podiatrists. Henderson

and Cabarrus each gained one provider, for a 33.3% increase in supply. The largest numeric change occurred in Forsyth (-3, -15.0%). Together, Forsyth, Guilford, Mecklenburg, and Wake accounted for more than one-third (36.3%) of all podiatrists in the state (89 out of 245).

North Carolina's **optometrist** workforce declined by 0.3% (-3) in 2005, the first decrease in supply since 2000. Twenty-two counties gained providers, twenty-six lost providers, and fifty-two counties experienced no change. Ten counties had no optometrists, including Graham which lost its sole practitioner in 2005; eight of these ten have had none since 1993. Swain (+1) had no optometrists in 2004 and gained one in 2005. Forsyth (+5, 12.8%), Guilford (-6, -11.5%), and Mecklenburg (-6, -6.0%) experienced the largest changes in number of optometrists.

Between 2004 and 2005, North Carolina's count of **chiropractors** grew by 0.2% (+2). Since 1993, there have been no losses in supply and 1995 and 1997 showed peak increases of 9.1% (+65) and 13.5% (+109) respectively. In 2005, sixteen counties increased their number of providers, fifteen lost providers, and sixty-nine experienced no change. Warren gained a sole provider for the first time since 1993. Twelve counties have no chiropractors, including ten counties that have remained without any chiropractors since 1993. Bladen and Granville had the largest percentage gains (+1, 50.0%) and Wayne had the most significant percentage loss (-3, -25.0%). Mecklenburg and Wake again accounted for a large proportion of chiropractors in the state (28.6%, 345 out of 1,207), up from 28.5% in 2004.

#### Respiratory Therapists

The number of **respiratory therapists** (RTs) in North Carolina increased 4.1% (+135) since the profession was added to the Health Professions Data System in 2004. From 2004 to 2005, forty counties gained providers, twenty-five lost providers, and thirty-five had no change. There are fifteen counties with no respiratory therapists and one county with only one practitioner (Yancey). Mecklenburg experienced the largest numeric change (+27, 7.3%) and Alexander showed the greatest percentage change (+2, 200.0%).

#### CHANGES IN PRACTITIONER TO POPULATION RATIOS

North Carolina's population increased 1.4% between 2004 and 2005, more than the 0.9% growth rate experienced the previous year<sup>9</sup>. Any examination of the changes in the supply and distribution of the health care workforce must take into account North Carolina's population growth rate, as well as the differences in population growth rates across counties of the state. To account for these factors, changes in health professional supply are illustrated in this section by examining the number of health care professionals per 10,000 people<sup>10</sup>. The practitioner per 10,000 population ratio provides a better mechanism to compare the supply and distribution of health professionals across varying geographic

areas than the use of simple raw counts. Tables 3 through 13 (except Table 5) include the ten highest and lowest ranked North Carolina counties based on active physicians, primary care physicians, registered nurses, dentists, and pharmacists per 10,000 population.

Table 5 provides the physician and primary care physician ratios per 10,000 population for the United States, North Carolina, and selected states that border North Carolina based on American Medical Association (AMA) data. Caution should be used in comparing these figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the data book because of differences in the data collection efforts at the AMA; the AMA master file relies on survey data and is updated throughout the year while the North Carolina licensure data are collected in October of every year.

Table 14 shows the practitioner-per-10,000 population ratios for all North Carolina counties in alphabetical order. Similar to Table 2, those licensed professionals for whom activity status is "unknown" are included in the "active" category. Professionals are only counted once and are located in counties based on primary practice location.

Physicians per 10,000 Population Ratio

The 2005 ratio of N.C. physicians per 10,000 population increased slightly to 20.7, up from 20.3 in 2004. The counties with the ten largest and ten smallest ratios in 2005 are included in Tables 3 and 4.

According to the data from the AMA and the U.S. Census Bureau, as seen in Table 5, there were, on average, about 24.8 physicians per 10,000 population in the United States at the beginning of 2004. This is up slightly from 22.8 in 2003. According to the AMA data, North Carolina's ratio was 22.5, slightly lower than the national average.

Compared to adjacent states, North Carolina has fewer physicians per 10,000 population than Tennessee and Virginia, but more physicians per population than Georgia and South Carolina. As mentioned earlier, the county- and state-level ratios using the N.C. Medical Board data are difficult to compare with the AMA figures due to differences in methodology and timing of data collection and reporting.

Primary Care Physicians per 10,000 Population Ratio

On average, there were 8.8 primary care physicians per 10,000 population in North Carolina in 2005, a slight increase from 8.6 in 2004. Tables 6 and 7 illustrate the counties with the largest and the smallest primary care physician per 10,000 ratios.

According to the national AMA data (see Table 5 on page 13) which, as mentioned previously, has differences in data collection and timing of collection, there were 10.2 primary care physicians per 10,000 population on average in the United States at the beginning of 2004. This compares to a ratio in North Carolina of 8.8 primary care physicians per 10,000 population<sup>11</sup>. Tennessee and Virginia had larger numbers of primary care physicians per 10,000 population than North Carolina (with ratios of 9.7 and

10.0 respectively), and Georgia and South Carolina had smaller ratios (with ratios of 8.6 and 8.9 respectively).

#### Dentists per 10,000 Population Ratio

North Carolina had 4.4 dentists per 10,000 population in 2005, a slight increase from 4.2 per 10,000 population in 2004. National statistics show a ratio of 5.5 dentists per 10,000 population in 2005<sup>12</sup>. Caution should be used in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book because of differences in the data collection efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Tables 8 and 9 report the counties with the ten largest and ten smallest supply of dentists per 10,000 population ratios in 2004. Of the four counties tied for 100, three—Camden, Hyde and Tyrrell—have not had a dentist with a primary practice location in the county since 1995 while Gates lost its sole dentist in 2005.

Registered Nurses per 10,000 Population Ratio

The average number of registered nurses (RNs) per 10,000 population increased slightly from 90.7 in 2004 to 92.1 in 2005. North Carolina's supply of RNs per 10,000 population is higher than the most current national statistic of 81.5 RNs per 10,000 population in 2005. Caution should be used in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book because of differences in the data collection efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics<sup>13</sup>. Tables 10 and 11 represent the counties with the largest and the smallest registered nurses per 10,000 population ratios in year 2005.

#### Pharmacists per 10,000 Population Ratio

On average, the state had 8.4 licensed pharmacists per 10,000 population in 2005, down slightly from 8.5 in 2004 and the same as national ratio<sup>14</sup>. Again, the reader is cautioned to use care in comparing these national figures to the ratios shown elsewhere in the book because of differences in the data collection efforts of the Bureau of Labor Statistics. See Tables 12 and 13 for the North Carolina counties ranking the highest and lowest pharmacists to population ratios.

## Appendix I: Technical Notes on Methods

This report is based on registration data obtained on selected licensed health professional categories within North Carolina between November 1, 2004 and October 31, 2005.

Data on the licensed health professionals profiled in this report were collected from both initial and renewal licensure forms by their respective licensing boards. All boards supplied computerized copies of their files containing all necessary data to the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research. All data files were run through a series of editing programs and procedures to check for inconsistencies.

Data were updated on a regular basis at each board with new licensees as well as changes in address. Physician data were checked and corrected for residency status using data supplied by hospitals with postgraduate medical education programs. Physician specialty data obtained from the 2005 *North Carolina Medical Society Roster* were used to check primary specialty codes. Physicians are the only profession assigned to county location based on ZIP code information.

## Appendix II: Definition of Terms

Low-weight births are at increased risk of infant death and illness. The term premature is used in a number of publications. - HOSPBEDGEN: Beds in general hospitals. Defined as "beds in use" in hospitals, which are designated for short-stay use as licensed at the end of the third calendar quarter of the year. Included are beds for general medical or surgical use, beds that are for general psychiatric disorders, rehabilitation beds, eye-ear-nose-and-throat beds and pulmonary disease beds. Excluded are beds in all federal hospitals and state hospitals. An exception is the inclusion of beds in one state facility, UNC Hospitals in Orange County. Data for each county represent the sum of the beds in the general hospitals located in that county. Data for the state reflect the sum of beds in the counties. - 3001 PERSINC: Total personal income by place of residence (000s). The income received by, or on behalf of, all the residents of the area. Includes income received by persons from all sources from participation in production, from transfer payments, from government and business, and from government interest (which is treated like a transfer payment). Personal income is the sum of wage and salary disbursements, other labor income, proprietors' income with inventory valuation and capital consumption adjustments, rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and transfer payments, less personal contributions for social insurance. For counting income, persons are defined as individuals, nonprofit institutions, private non-insured welfare funds, and private trust funds. The last three are referred to as "quasi-individuals." Proprietors' income is treated in its entirety as received by individuals. Life insurance carriers and private noninsured pension funds are not counted as persons, but their saving is credited to persons. Personal income is entirely different from money income, which is the measure of income used by Census and CPS. Source: Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis. - 3005 PERCAPINC: Per capita income by place of residence. The total personal income of residents of an area divided by the resident population of the area. See BEAPOP and PERSINC. Per capita personal income serves as an indicator of the quality of consumer markets and of the economic well-being of the residents of an area. It should be used with caution for several reasons: (1) An unusually high or low per capita income may be the temporary result of unusual conditions such as a bumper crop, a major construction project, or a catastrophe. In some cases, a high per capita income is not representative of the standard of living in an area. Conversely a county with a large institutional population may show an unusually low per capita income. (2) Population is measured at mid-year and income is measured as a flow over the year, so a significant change in population during the year could cause a distortion in the per capita figures. (3) Farm proprietors' income reflects return from current production; it does not measure current cash flows. Sales out of inventories, though included in current gross farm income, are excluded from net farm income because they represent income from a previous year's production. Additions to inventories are included in net farm income at current market prices. (4) In counties that are characterized by small population and almost total dependence upon farming, the per capita income will react more sharply to the vagaries in weather, world market demand, and changing government policies related to agriculture than in counties where the sources of income are more diversified. A projection differs from an estimate in that it relies on certain assumptions about long-term trends in data, which are not yet available, while an estimate is always based on data from predictor variables, which are available for the estimate year. MSAs are multicounty regions determined by the federal government based on population and commuting data from the census. MSA93 represents the 1993 revision, based on the 1990 Census. Since only North Carolina data are available in LINC, any MSA which includes counties outside N.C. is not completely covered in LINC, but instead, the N.C. counties in that MSA are used, and 'N.C. only' is placed on the end of the MSA name to denote this fact. The non-metropolitan counties (not in any MSA) are grouped together as though they were an additional MSA, Non-metropolitan Counties. Source: N.C. Office of State Budget and Management. # Appendix III: Procedures for Requesting Additional Information

#### Procedures for Requesting Additional Information

This appendix describes the health professions information available through the North Carolina Health Professions Data System at the Cecil G. Sheps Center for Health Services Research and the necessary procedures for obtaining data.

The Sheps Center maintains health professions data files through a cooperative effort with each licensing board for the following categories of health professionals licensed in North Carolina:

- Certified Nurse Midwives
- Chiropractors
- Dental Hygienists
- Dentists
- Nurses (RNs and LPNs)
- Nurse Practitioners
- Optometrists
- Pharmacists
- Physical Therapists
- Physical Therapist Assistants
- Physicians, includes MDs and DOs licensed by the North Carolina Medical Board
- Physicians in Residency Training
- Physician Assistants
- Podiatrists
- Practicing Psychologists
- Psychological Associates
- Respiratory Therapists

Although the Sheps Center does have files for each year since 1975<sup>18</sup>, the data prior to 1979 are relatively inaccurate, and therefore their use is discouraged.

Health professionals provide the data to the respective licensing boards at the time of initial license or renewal. The data are tabulated by the Sheps Center, but at all times remain the property of the boards. The data are confidential because they include detailed information on the individuals licensed. Therefore, any requests for names, addresses, or other information that would lead to identification of any individuals cannot be honored without the prior written approval of the appropriate licensing board.

Data are provided in several formats: electronic mailing lists, cross-tabulations, frequencies and graphic representations. A two-week interval is normally required to process data requests, with a minimum charge dependent upon the type of output. Please visit the Health Professions Data System web site at <a href="http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp">http://www.shepscenter.unc.edu/hp</a> for more information.

When board approval is necessary, the following steps should be taken:

- 1. Contact the Sheps Center's N.C. Health Professions Data System Coordinator by phone (919)966-7112, email (nchp@unc.edu) or letter to discuss the details of your request. Direct verbal or written approval from the executive officer of the appropriate board is required before any data can be released by the Sheps Center.
- 2. A letter should be sent to the executive officer of the appropriate board (see list on following pages) explaining the need for the data in question, and the preferred format of the data. If the data are for an announcement or a survey, a copy of the brochure or questionnaire to be sent is usually helpful. The letter should request that approval be granted to the Sheps Center to provide the data. Sending a copy of the letter to the Sheps Center Coordinator is helpful.

Board approval is normally not required if the data requested do not identify individuals. For requests of this type only a letter, email or telephone call to the Coordinator is required. A phone call is helpful to ensure that your request is clear.

If data are required immediately, the request should indicate the urgency. An urgent request will be processed as soon as it can be scheduled into the workload, and an additional charge will be assessed. However, no assurance can be given as to delivery date earlier than two weeks after the request has been received. Whenever possible, a two-week interval should be anticipated for the processing of routine requests; a longer period will be required if extensive programming is needed.
